#### Directions for Home Reading Books

Your child will read their selections at least one time to themselves. Then he/she can read the book to other family members, relatives, or friends. I suggest that your child read his/her books to more than one audience.

- 2 Have your child write the title of his/her home reading selections on the Home Reading Log. Please help him/her to use capital letters at the beginning of each word in the title. Also, write the number of times the books are read by your child next to the book title.
- 3 Sign the Home Reading Log to indicate that the information is correct and complete. Write any comments that you may have about your child's reading, the book selection, or any other concerns that you may have in the 'Comments' section of the Home Reading Log.
- 4 Return the Home Reading 8ag with the books and Home Reading Log enclosed. This bag will need to be returned each Thursday in order to check out new books.
